Sunnyvale School District Bond Measure
Official Argument in Favor of Measure P

Eight years ago, 85% of voters in the Sunnyvale School District generously approved Measure A to begin the repair and renovation of our aging elementary and middle school facilities. These funds have been used to replace leaky roofs, upgrade outdated electrical systems, renovate classrooms and science labs, remove asbestos and build new classrooms.

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These projects were completed on time and under budget. The school district recently refinanced these bonds. Securing a lower interest rate saved taxpayers money.

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While much improved, Sunnyvale's elementary and middle schools are 40 to 60 years old and further repairs and renovations are needed. For example, leaks in our water system are common. One of these leaks recently resulted in the flooding of a school library.

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Measure P will fund the next phase of school repairs in the Sunnyvale School District. Specifically, Measure P will:

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- Replace aging gas, water, and sewer lines
- Improve and expand school libraries
- Replace outdated heating and cooling equipment with energy efficient systems
- Build permanent classroom facilities to replace selected portable classrooms
- Expand school facilities to relieve student overcrowding

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Measure P calls for an independent citizens' oversight committee that will ensure all funds are spent responsibly and according to the voter-approved plan. By law, funds from this measure can only be used to upgrade school facilities, not for salaries or administration.

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All funds from Measure P will stay within Sunnyvale School District to improve our aging neighborhood school facilities. The cost of Measure P is deductible on your state and federal income taxes.

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Parents, teachers, school officials and local business leaders agree that Measure P is essential to maintain quality education in our community. Good neighborhood schools help keep our property values high.
